
Background

- ❖ I chose this topic because sexual violence is something that occurs too often and isn't talked about enough.
- ❖ This is an important wellness issue because using force in sexual interactions is one of the most serious problems in human relationships.
- ❖ Due to the high rate of sexual violence too many victims have been physically and psychologically harmed.




Support on my stance

- ❖ Fewer than 40% of crimes such as sexual assault, rape, statutory rape, and date rape are reported, even though most victims know their assailants.
- ❖ Out of every 1,000 rapes, only 233 are reported to the police and yet only 6 rapists will face jail time.
- ❖ 1 in 5 women and 1 in 71 men have reported having experienced an attempt or a completed rape.
- ❖ Strong evidence suggests that 15% of American women who have ever been married have been raped by their husbands or ex-husbands



Opposition on my stance

- ❖ Men's rights activism (MRA) has counterclaimed that “just because you regret a one-night stand doesn't mean it wasn't consensual” referencing the award-winning campaign “don't be THAT guy”
- ❖ Sexual violence on University campuses have been excoriated as abuse of men rights that stigmatize innocent men as predators or rapists. (MacDonald 2014)
- ❖ Defamation lawsuits have been stacking in china ever since women have been speaking up about their sexual violence experiences. For example, when a Chinese student at the University of Minnesota Liu Jingyao accused Richard Lui of rape. Mr. Lui demanded \$436,000 plus legal expenses and an apology. Claiming that his reputation was being highly damaged by false accusations.



Conclusion

Sexual violence is undoubtedly a very serious problem in human relationships. People must understand that sexual violence can happen to anyone no matter the gender, though unfortunately it is most likely to occur to women. Due to this it has become obvious that sexual violence advocacy has been condemned as a “far left feminist thing” and a war against “Men’s rights.” Such false arguments dismantle the bigger issue at hand which is sexual violence against women. This in no way saying that sexual violence does not happen to men but instead emphasizing that women are the most oppressed by sexual assault. So, it is not a surprise most women are experiencing sexual violence and reporting it. In conclusion I believe all sexual violence accusations should be taken serious no matter the accuser's gender.








